





PROGRAM FOR INFANT TODDLER CARE (PITC) MODULE 1: SOCIAL-EMOTIONAL GROWTH & SOCIALIZATION

When: July 19th & 20th 5:30pm – 9:00pm

Social-Emotional Growth and Socialization explores topics on social-emotional development in the first three years, temperaments of children and caregivers, socialization, guidance and discipline, environments, and gaining an understanding of children's behavior. Training will begin with an overview of the basic concepts of early social-emotional growth and socialization and their application to the group care context. An emphasis i placed on the development of a nurturing relationship between the infant and caregiver. The overview addresses the importance of responsive caregiving, the individualization of care through an understanding of infant temperament, the critical role of family and culture in early identity development, exploring developmentally appropriate play strategies with ages of infancy, creating supportive physical environments, and stages of emotional development.





HEALTH AND SAFETY TRAINING REQUIREMENTS

CHILD DEVELOPMENT, HEALTH, AND SAFETY BASICS

Emphasis will be on understanding patterns of development, developmental domains, and the role of nutrition in development. In addition, health and safety issues will address supporting the growth of healthy children - from the basics such as hand washing to more indepth practices surrounding healthy procedures and disease prevention. 


